LESSONS

(Seated)

2 Samuel 6:1-2,5,14,17-19

⁶ David again gathered all the chosen men of Israel, thirty thousand. ² David and all the people with him set out and went from Baale-judah, to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the Lord of hosts who is enthroned on the cherubim.

⁵ David and all the house of Israel were dancing before the Lord with all their might, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals.

¹⁴ David danced before the LORD with all his might; David was girded with a linen ephod.

¹⁷ They brought in the ark of the LORD, and set it in its place, inside the tent that David had pitched for it; and David offered burnt offerings and offerings of well-being before the LORD. ¹⁸ When David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the offerings of well-being, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of

hosts, ¹⁹ and distributed food among all the people, the whole multitude of Israel, both men and women, to each a cake of bread, a portion of meat, and a cake of raisins. Then all the people went back to their homes.

NICENE CREED

(Standing)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Did you know...

EDWARD I. LEIGHTON

Edward Leighton (1850-1916) was born at Birmingham, England immigrating to Cleveland, Ohio with his parents when he was six years old. He was the founder of a machinery company, Van Dorn & Dutton. He and his family were winter residents and he was a director of the choir for twenty years. He died suddenly of pneumonia in St. Augustine. A stained-glass window "The Good Shepherd" is dedicated in his memory.
